



Outpatient Attending Position at NewYork-Presbyterian/Westchester Division

Weill Cornell Medicine's Department of Psychiatry in conjunction with NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital is seeking to recruit a Psychiatrist for a Service Chief position in Adult Ambulatory Service at NewYork-Presbyterian/Westchester in White Plains, New York. The Adult Ambulatory Service at NYP-WD consists of an outpatient clinic with a number of subspecialty programs as well as a 36-slot partial hospital program with separate tracks devoted to affective/personality disorders, psychotic disorders, and eating disorders. The administrative role consists of providing supervision and mentorship to attending psychiatrists, overseeing the smooth functioning of educational and training activities, and working closely with the Director of Adult Ambulatory Care Services to ensure optimal operation of the service. Other significant responsibilities include working with a multidisciplinary team to provide clinical care to patients and teaching and supervision of nurse practitioners, medical students, residents, and postdocs.

Minimum Requirements: Board certified or eligible in Psychiatry. Possess or be eligible for a NYS license. Established academically-oriented physicians with a strong clinical skills are encouraged to apply. Prior administrative experience strongly preferred.
