



Seeking Candidates for Associate Director of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Residency Training Program

Weill Cornell Medicine is seeking qualified candidates for an exciting opportunity to serve as the Associate Director of the Child and Adolescent Training Program in Psychiatry. The ACGME-accredited program is a collaboration among NewYork-Presbyterian, the Departments of Psychiatry at the Columbia University Vagelos College of Physicians and Surgeons and Weill Cornell Medicine, and the New York State Office of Mental Health. The program is the largest child and adolescent psychiatry training program in the country and has substantial clinical diversity and academic breadth across its four core sites.

Position Responsibilities: The successful candidate will be responsible for: engaging in direct teaching and training; evaluating and supervising residents; mentoring; developing, monitoring, and evaluating didactic courses and rotation schedules; recruiting, scheduling, and evaluating supervisors; engaging in ongoing program development; co-chairing or chairing internal committees including Residency Selection Committee, Program Evaluation Committee, and Clinical Competency Committees. The position also entails assisting with the annual resident recruitment process; accreditation processes; and participating in departmental, institutional, and national committees and collaboration with the Program Director of the NYP Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Residency Training Program, who is based at Columbia University Irving Medical Center. The position has half-time administrative responsibilities and half-time outpatient clinical responsibilities, which will be tailored to the candidate's professional interests and expertise.

Candidates must demonstrate a strong commitment to intellectually rigorous clinical training that encompasses biologic and psychosocial perspectives; resident personal development, and well-being; creative thinking and leadership; collaboration with psychiatric colleagues across departments, divisions, and disciplines; collaboration with faculty peers and community partners; high quality clinical care; and diversity, equity, inclusion. Candidates must also exhibit outstanding interpersonal skills, judgment, initiative, thoughtfulness, and organization and be a model of professionalism.

We welcome applications from candidates who share our commitment to fostering a culture of fairness, equity, and belonging.
