Weill Cornell Medicine's Department of Psychiatry is seeking a **psychiatrist** for a full-time faculty position with clinical responsibilities in <u>New York Presbyterian's Center for Special Studies</u>, a multi-disciplinary primary care program for adults with HIV, or at risk for HIV. The successful candidate will collaborate with an interdisciplinary team to provide ongoing assessment, psychopharmacology, and therapy to a culturally diverse population across the outpatient and inpatient settings. All faculty members contribute to teaching, training, and education. Pursuit of research and scholarly activities is encouraged.

The Center for Special Studies offers a very high standard of care in a welcoming setting and has been a leader in HIV care since 1988. The program features four full time psychiatrists working at two locations. The structure affords collegiality, manageable case-loads, the time necessary to provide individualized and thorough care, and the ability to build strong and lasting relationships with patients. Patients who require hospitalization are admitted to and followed by their outpatient teams at New York Presbyterian Weill Cornell Medical Center, a nationally recognized university teaching hospital.

**Minimum Qualifications:** Candidates must be board certified or eligible in Psychiatry and possess or be eligible for a license in the state of New York. Academically oriented candidates with experience in HIV, Consultation Liaison Psychiatry, or Addiction Psychiatry strongly preferred.
