Telepsychiatry Attending Positions in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry

Responsibilities include providing emergency evaluation, management, and linkage to other services for children, adolescents, and young adults up to age 20 who are presenting to the emergency services and are admitted to the inpatient services of NewYork-Presbyterian and its enterprise hospitals. The schedule will be rotating daytime shifts that includes some weekend days. Work arrangements are flexible with the option to work either remotely or in the office.

Minimum Qualifications: Board certified or eligible in psychiatry and child adolescent psychiatry. Must possess or be eligible for a New York State license.
