Weill Cornell Medicine's Department of Psychiatry in conjunction with NewYork-Presbyterian (NYP) is seeking to recruit a child and adolescent Psychiatrist for an inpatient attending position on our general acute care service at NYP's Westchester Behavioral Health Center in White Plains, New York. Academically-oriented physicians with a strong foundation in the assessment and treatment of children and adolescents with psychiatric disorders are encouraged to apply. Responsibilities include collaborating with a multidisciplinary team to provide outstanding assessment and clinical care to patients and families. The position entails the education and training of medical students, residents, and trainees across disciplines.

Minimum Requirements:

Board certified or eligible in Psychiatry and Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. Completion of a child and adolescent psychiatry fellowship. Possess or be eligible for a NYS license.
