Position Description:

Weill Cornell Medicine's Department of Psychiatry is seeking an academically oriented psychiatrist for a full-time inpatient position on Greenberg 11N at NewYork-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center in Manhattan. Greenberg 11N is a 32-bed inpatient psychiatric unit with a clinical focus on the treatment of patients with co-occurring serious mental illness and complex medical conditions that cannot be effectively managed in freestanding psychiatric settings. The unit emphasizes the integration of neuromodulation, interventional psychiatry, and collaborative care approaches in the delivery of acute psychiatric treatment.

Greenberg 11N serves as a core clinical rotation site for first- and second-year psychiatry residents and a clerkship site for medical students. The successful candidate will lead a multidisciplinary team in providing high-quality inpatient psychiatric care while contributing to the academic mission of the Department through teaching, supervision, quality improvement, and scholarly activities.

Physicians with a strong academic interest and expertise in the assessment and treatment of general psychiatric disorders are encouraged to apply.

Founded in 1898 and affiliated with what is now NewYork-Presbyterian since 1927, Weill Cornell Medical College is among the nation's leading academic medical centers. The Department of Psychiatry is one of the largest and most distinguished psychiatry departments in the country, with a longstanding commitment to excellence in patient care, education, and research. Our programs at NewYork-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center in Manhattan and NewYork-Presbyterian Westchester Behavioral Health Center in White Plains are recognized for the breadth and quality of their inpatient and outpatient specialty services.

Responsibilities include:

- Provide psychiatric care for patients admitted to Greenberg 11N.
- Lead and collaborate with a multidisciplinary treatment team in the management of patients with serious mental illness and complex medical comorbidities.
- Participate in treatment planning, discharge planning, and coordination of care with outpatient providers and community resources.
- Supervise and teach psychiatry residents, medical students, and other trainees.
- Participate in departmental conferences, educational programs, and academic activities.
- Contribute to quality improvement, patient safety, and program development initiatives.
- Support the Department's mission in clinical care, education, and scholarship.

Minimum Qualifications:

- MD, DO, or equivalent medical degree.
- Board Certified or Board Eligible in Psychiatry.
- Eligible for medical licensure in New York State.
- Eligible for faculty appointment at Weill Cornell Medicine.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Experience treating patients with serious mental illness in inpatient settings.

- Interest or experience in consultation-liaison psychiatry, interventional psychiatry, neuromodulation, or collaborative care.
- Demonstrated commitment to medical education and trainee supervision.
- Participation in scholarly activities, quality improvement, or clinical research.
- Strong interpersonal and interdisciplinary leadership skills.

Minimum/Maximum Compensation: \$309,000 per annum.
