Position Title: Inpatient Psychiatrist for Orthodox Jewish Mental Health Service

Location: NewYork-Presbyterian Westchester Behavioral Health, White Plains, New York

Weill Cornell Medicine's Department of Psychiatry is seeking a staff psychiatrist for The Horizon Inpatient Program at NewYork-Presbyterian Westchester Behavioral Health Center. The program provides inpatient psychiatric care to adults from the Orthodox Jewish community and is designed to enhance patient comfort and engagement during hospitalization. The unit serves adults aged 18 and older with a broad range of psychiatric disorders and addresses specific cultural and religious needs, including kosher meals and other accommodations.

The successful candidate will lead a multidisciplinary treatment team in the delivery of high-quality clinical care. Additional responsibilities include teaching and supervision of medical students, residents, and other trainees. Physicians with a strong foundation in the assessment and treatment of general psychiatric disorders and an interest in academic psychiatry are encouraged to apply. Familiarity with the program's cultural focus is not required; however, an interest in cultural psychiatry is preferred. Candidates must be board-certified or board-eligible in Psychiatry and hold, or be eligible for, a New York State medical license.

This unique program is dedicated to delivering the highest standard of inpatient psychiatric treatment while integrating cultural and religious identity into assessment, formulation, treatment planning, and discharge. Our team works closely with chaplains, families, and established community partners to provide care that is clinically excellent, culturally respectful, and stigma-reducing.

Key Responsibilities:

- Provide high-quality, culturally attuned inpatient psychiatric care within a multidisciplinary team.
- Participate in daily interdisciplinary rounds and unit-based programming.
- Teach and supervise medical students, psychiatry residents, and psychology trainees as part of Weill Cornell Medicine's academic mission.
- Partner with Orthodox Jewish community liaisons, families, and chaplaincy to support individualized care and discharge planning.
- Contribute to a culture of clinical excellence, collaboration, and cultural competence in both patient care and education.

Minimum Requirements

- Board-certified or board-eligible in Psychiatry.
- Eligible for or currently holding a New York State medical license.
- Strong interest in inpatient care, cultural psychiatry, and/or working with diverse communities.

Minimum/Maximum Annual Base Salary: \$309,000
