Position: Clinical Psychologist for Outpatient Position

Location: NewYork-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center, Upper East Side, Manhattan

Position Overview: Weill Cornell Medicine's Department of Psychiatry is seeking a psychologist for a full-time faculty position based in the adult psychiatry ambulatory program of NewYork-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center. The successful candidate will work collaboratively within a multidisciplinary team to conduct comprehensive psychological assessments and provide individual and group psychotherapy. Additional responsibilities include developing time-limited, evidence-based treatment protocols for both group and individual therapy, overseeing their implementation, and supervising psychology trainees.

Position Responsibilities:

- Performs comprehensive psychological evaluations to assess patients' mental health treatment needs.
- Collaborates with patients and a multidisciplinary treatment team to develop and implement individualized treatment plans focused on evidence-based interventions.
- Provides evidence-based individual and group psychotherapeutic interventions that are brief and/or time-limited.
- Helps lead the development and evaluation of individual and group psychotherapeutic interventions, including through data collection and research/scholarly work
- Educates patients on mental health conditions and treatment options.
- Contributes to the clinical supervision and teaching of psychology trainees (interns and postdoctoral fellows) rotating through the ambulatory program and Partial Hospital Program (PHP), in coordination with psychology education leadership.
- Participates in programmatic, Department, and institutional meetings as needed.
- Communicates with patients' other health care providers for coordination of care.
- Maintains accurate and up-to-date medical records in compliance with best practices, hospital policies, regulatory requirements and appropriate insurance billing practices.
- Engages in continuous professional development, staying up to date on advancements in psychology.
- Demonstrates a commitment to working with diverse populations.
- Supports the development of clinical programming focused on increasing access and reducing symptomatology in patients with varied clinical and social backgrounds.

Minimum Qualifications: Applicants must have a doctoral degree in clinical Psychology from an APA-accredited program and should possess or be eligible for NY state licensure. Start date is flexible with earliest start date summer of 2026. Candidates must also be academically oriented, excellent communication and organizational skills; strong work ethic; proactive and highly collaborative.

Application deadline: April 3, 2026 and then until the position is filled.

Start Date: August 1, 2026 (contingent upon 4-month credentialing process)

Salary: Minimum/Maximum salary is \$143,840.
