Weill Cornell Medicine's Department of Psychiatry in conjunction with NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital is seeking to recruit a Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist for an outpatient attending position in the Center for Autism and the Developing Brain (CADB) at NewYork-Presbyterian Westchester Campus in White Plains, NY. Academically-oriented physicians with a strong foundation in the assessment and treatment of psychiatric disorders in children and adolescents with neurodevelopmental disorders, including autism spectrum disorder, are encouraged to apply. Research opportunities are substantial, including participation in clinical trials of novel compounds in autism spectrum disorder and related genetic disorders. Up to 50% time for mentored or independent research is available for interested and qualified candidates.

As Chief of the Medical Service for the Center for Autism and the Developing Brain, you will be responsible for providing medical leadership for the program that includes participating in interdisciplinary assessments of children, adolescents, and adults suspected of having Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). You will provide follow-up treatment, collaborate with team members representing various disciplines, and provide medication management and medical consultations as needed. We look forward to your participation in educational activities and supervision of trainees at all levels. We also expect that you may occasionally provide consultation to the inpatient service on ASD patients.

Minimum Requirements: Board-certified or board-eligible in Psychiatry and Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. Completion of an ACGME-accredited fellowship in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. Possess or be eligible for a NYS license.
