



Weill Cornell Medicine's Department of Psychiatry is seeking a psychologist for a full-time faculty position based in the Ambulatory Services Program at NewYork-Presbyterian/Westchester Behavior Health Center in White Plains, New York. The selected candidate will oversee our adolescent and youth DBT clinical and training program. The individual will be responsible for diagnostic evaluations and psychotherapy of adults within an interdisciplinary team. The psychologist will provide supervision to psychology and psychiatry trainees.

Minimum requirements: Applicants must have a doctoral degree in Clinical Psychology from an APA-accredited program and should possess or be eligible for NY state licensure. A strong foundation with DBT is required. Start date is flexible with earliest start date summer of 2020.
