

Weill Cornell Medicine's Department of Psychiatry is seeking a full-time psychologist for a full-time faculty position based in the Ambulatory Services Program at New York-Presbyterian/Westchester Division in White Plains, New York. The selected candidate will provide evidenced based psychotherapies, including CBT and DBT, to adults suffering from depression and other mood disturbances. The individual will be responsible for diagnostic evaluations and psychotherapy of adults within an interdisciplinary team. The emphasis will be on the treatment of individuals in mid to later adulthood. The psychologist will provide supervision to psychology and psychiatry trainees.

Minimum requirements: Applicants must have a doctoral degree in Clinical Psychology from an APA-accredited program and should possess or be eligible for NY state licensure. Start date is flexible with earliest start date July 1, 2017.
